Founded in 2020, the Bayou City Ballet Youth Company provides high quality performance opportunities for advanced ballet students pursuing a professional

career in dance. We strongly believe in the power of ballet to change lives. In order to share this beautiful art with our entire community, we program an array of educational programs throughout the greater Houston area each season, including master classes, performances, and workshops, that are accessible to everyone. The Youth Company also raises funds annually to help defray the costs associated with performance, thereby allowing us to offer need-based financial assistance to our dancers.

The Bayou City Ballet Youth Company is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, with an annual budget just under \$50K. The company performs eight times per year in Houston, and hosts an array of masterclasses each season taught by a diverse faculty of both current and former internationally-celebrated professional ballet dancers. As well, the company has a track record of commissioning new choreography by artists from underrepresented groups.

It will be held again at the Chateau Crystale Remington Ballroom in Westchase District, Sunday December 11th, 2022, from 1-5pm.

We are excited to present once again this new annual Westchase holiday tradition! Our first year, we had over 100 guests, with six local vendors and twenty artists performing. There were two abridged ballet performances, and a children's story time. Performing alongside our pre-professional Youth Company dancers were guest principal artists Connor Walsh and Chae eun Yang from the Houston Ballet. Throughout the afternoon Axiom Quartet provided live music for holiday shoppers. All vendor sales benefited each individual business directly, with no cost to them. Additionally our organization raised \$2570 in donations to support our mission, and we hope to raise even more this year.

Please tell us a little about your organization (History and Mission)	nonPareil was founded in 2008 by two fathers looking to provide a path for the future for their young sons with autism. They asked themselves the same questions many parents of children with autism ask, "What resources are available in the community that can help my child today, in a practical and predictable way? What happens when my child grows up?" By starting nonPareil, co- founders Dan Selec and Gary Moore created an opportunity for their sons to focus on their affinity for technology. They knew if this passion could be harnessed in the form of technical ability, an entirely new method of communication, expression, and productivity would be possible. Thus, the vision of nonPareil was established: Building Better Futures for Adults with Autism.	
	In September 2010, nonPareil Institute began operations on the Southern Methodist University campus in Plano, TX. The program quickly grew from 8 to 52 students, who are known as "Crew"	

within the nonPareil structure. Within 10 years, the original vision grew to include four nonPareil locations in Texas and Florida, serving over 250 adult students with autism in 2021. Over 650 adults with autism have received services from the nonPareil Institute over the past 12 years.

The mission of nonPareil is to offer a post-secondary instructional program helping adults with autism progress toward their potential by integrating work readiness training with hands-on technical instruction and social engagement opportunities. nonPareil Institute's innovative technical vocational and work readiness program is designed specifically for adults with autism. nonPareil seeks to lower the extraordinarily high rate of unemployed talented adults with autism by teaching skills that enable students to work on teams, thrive in a professional environment, work on outsource projects, and turn their passion for technology into potential careers. Every person deserves the opportunity to further their education in a place where they feel safe and supported, and nonPareil strives to provide that environment for its students.
