about your organization (History and Mission)	Founded in 2020, the Bayou City Ballet Youth Company provides high quality performance opportunities for advanced ballet students pursuing a professional career in dance. We strongly believe in the power of ballet to change lives. In order to share this beautiful art with our entire community, we program an array of educational programs throughout the greater Houston area each season, including master classes, performances, and workshops, that are accessible to everyone. The Youth Company also raises funds annually to help defray the costs associated with performance, thereby allowing us to offer need-based financial assistance to our dancers.
	The Bayou City Ballet Youth Company is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, with an annual budget just under \$50K. The company performs eight times per year in Houston, and hosts an array of masterclasses each season taught by a diverse faculty of both current

and former internationally-celebrated professional ballet dancers. As well, the company has a track record of commissioning new choreography by artists from underrepresented groups.

With the support of Westchase District Community Fund, the past three years we have presented abridged ballet performances of the Nutcracker at our Westchase Nutcracker Festival, a free communitybuilding event that involved multiple local small businesses and created awareness within Westchase District. This year, however, our board of directors determined the rental cost of the venue was too high to continue offering the event for free. Upon further reflection of the audience sizes, coupled with a desire for a fully-staged version of this holiday ballet for West Houston, we began to explore other options of how to make a bigger impact that would also be more financially sustainable. A vision for a community Nutcracker was born! Bayou City Ballet Youth Company respectfully requests financial support from the Westchase District Community Fund for our inaugural full-length production of "The Nutcracker," produced in partnership with Alief Independent School District. The money donated will go towards scholarships for Alief District students participating in our production, covering their costs of costumes, tights, ballet shoes, and training/rehearsal fees.

We have received approval from the Alief Independent School District leadership to produce two fully-staged performances of "The Nutcracker" at Kerr High School, Saturday December 9th and Sunday December 10th, 2023. Our professionally-run production will involve 40 Alief ISD students alongside dancers of the Bayou City Ballet Youth Company. In addition to student performers, professional guest artists

Katlyn Addison and Adrian Frye from Salt Lake City's Ballet West will dance the grand pas de deux of the Sugar Plum Fairy and Cavalier. We are proud to present professional level ballet to the general public of West Houston with tickets costing only \$10!

According to the Alief District Fine Arts director, Renford Jame, the District is severely underserved in the area of performing arts education, so the opportunity for kids to perform in a classical ballet like this will change lives. We are honored to be able to make such a significant impact in the lives of students and families throughout Alief ISD, which includes many children who live and attend school within the Westchase District.

All Alief ISD students 2nd through 5th grade are invited to audition (held on September 9th at Alief Middle School). In an aim to remove financial barriers to participation, Bayou City Ballet Youth Company's board of directors has agreed to provide FULL scholarships to students selected through the district audition. Scholarships will cover 100% of participation costs, including rehearsal fees, tights, ballet shoes, costume, and even includes two complimentary tickets to their performance of The Nutcracker. This is approximately a \$250 value for each child, totaling roughly \$10,000 in scholarships. Students will come to Bayou City Ballet School for training and rehearsals once per week for ten weeks leading up to the performances.

We have already raised \$2500 from individual donors, with another \$1250 pledged by August. We still have a ways to go to raise the money to cover other costs of this ambitious project and we hope the Westchase District Community Fund will want to partner with us again. We welcome any support the WDCF is able to provide.
